RECYCLE AND REDUCE WASTE ON YOUR JOB SITE



1. PLAN AHEAD

Prior to starting your project, contact CR&R to find out what options will work best for your site. Planning ahead will assist you in diverting as much material as possible, as cost effectively as possible.

2. SOURCE SEPARATION

To source separate, you must have one container on your site for each type of material. The types of materials may include wood, concrete, asphalt, cardboard, green waste and metal. Other materials may be available to recycle as well. Please call our office for more information.

3. MIXED RECYCLING

The mixed recycling method is ideal for projects with limited space or projects generating a large amount of varied materials all at the same time. All C&D materials can be mixed into one container for processing.

4. REUSE OR DONATIONS

Depending on the characteristics of your project, you may have the opportunity to reuse or donate items. For example, processed concrete or asphalt may be used as part of a new foundation. Windows, doors and other fixtures may find a good home with local organizations.
