

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- 1 The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:00 am on collection day and removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
- 2 The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i. e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).
- 4 Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.

TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers (3 cubic yards to 40 cubic yards) are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs. For additional pricing details or to arrange for a delivery of a larger container to your residence or business, please call CR&R Customer Service.



BULKY ITEMS, ELECTRONIC WASTE, & WHITE GOODS

Items that cannot properly fit in your container, such as a chair or desk, are considered bulky items and require a special pick up. Electronic waste [e-waste] is anything with a circuit board or battery, such as computers, telephones and small printers. White goods [e.g. refrigerators, freezers] and electronic waste cannot be disposed of in your container. CR&R will collect and properly recycle these items.

**NEW RESIDENTS:** If you are a new resident you may use your bulky item service to collect all of your paper, cardboard and packing material.

SHARPS\*

CR&R offers residents a unique, safe and convenient Sharps Disposal by Mail Program. If requested, a Sharps container will be delivered to your home in a postage prepaid return-by-mail shipping box with instructions in english and spanish. When the Sharps container is full or when your drug therapy is concluded, simply return the Sharps container in its original packaging. Rates and restrictions apply. HAZARDOUS WASTE

Hazardous wastes are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive, or toxic. This includes batteries of all types, as they are considered hazardous waste in California when they are discarded. Therefore, it is illegal to dispose of them in regular trash or recycling; so don't place them in CR&R containers. This includes batteries of all types and sizes Alkaline (AAA, AA, C, D, 9 Volt), Lithium (button cell, power tool batteries, camera batteries, other electronics), Ni Cad (power tools), and other battery types both rechargeable and single use. Batteries must be taken to one of the following:

- recycling center, or
- household hazardous waste disposal facility, or
- universal waste handler, or
- local retailer (Home Depot, Lowes, Best Buy, Staples, Ikea, etc.)

Why is this important? When lithium batteries are improperly disposed of they can cause fires in recycling centers, landfills, and garbage and recycling trucks.

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day

If the Holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, trash will be collected on your normal collection day with no delays to your pickup.

If the Holiday falls during the work week, collection for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. For example, if Independence Day falls on a Monday, and your normal collection day is on Thursday, your pickup for that week will be on Friday.
