



Dear Tustin Resident,

The City of Tustin together with CR&R Environmental Services has launched a new Organics Recycling Program for all residential customers. Under this program, organic wastes including food scraps will be collected in a cart separate from the trash cart. Your residence is in an area that was determined to generate very little green waste or a landscaping company collects the green waste for the entire property and therefore, you currently do not have a green yard trimmings cart.

Beginning June 28th, a green organics cart will be delivered to your residence for the new Organics Recycling Program. In addition, CR&R will be distributing to your door a small Kitchen Food Scrap Container as a convenient way to collect food scraps in your kitchen before disposing of them in the green cart. Distribution will begin July 1st and continue over the next couple of months.

Delivery: A separate truck will deliver 1-35 gallon green organics cart beginning **June 28th** and continue through **July 22nd**. Your current service day will not change.

Your service will begin the week after you receive your organics cart. For example, if you receive the organics cart on July 1st, your first organic waste collection (green cart) will be July 8th.

What material may I place in the organics cart?

From your kitchen: Fruit, bread, fish, meat, vegetables, dairy, and FOG (fats, oil, and grease).

From your yard: Grass clippings, leaves, weeds, prunings, flowers, and other yard waste.

Items NOT Accepted in Green Organics Cart: Recyclables (plastic, glass, metal), Styrofoam, bones, pet waste, palm fronds, and trash.

Compostable bags are optional and available at local retailers. Other types of plastic bags are *not* accepted.
