



- Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights and stand.
- Do not place trees in plastic bags.
- Place tree in your organics cart or beside your carts for collection.
- be cut in half.












SENIOR CITIZEN & LOW INCOME DISCOUNTS

CR&R provides discounts to Senior Citizens and qualifying Low Income residential customers.

How do I qualify for the Senior Citizen Discount?

- Must be 65 years of age or older
- Must provide proof of being the head of household
- Must agree to reduce cart size to one 35-gallon capacity

How do I qualify for the Low Income Discount?

- Must provide proof of low income by submitting a copy of a utility bill showing a low income discount
- Name on utility bill identifying participation in the utility program must be head of household

TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers (from 3 yards to 40 yards) are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs.

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:30 am on collection day and removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
- The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any obstruction [i.e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees].
- Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. 4 Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.



Bulky Items

Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items. Bulky items must be manageable by a twoperson crew. You may arrange for free bulky item collection by calling customer service

Examples of Bulky Items Include

- Miscellaneous Furniture
 Used tires
- Excessive green waste Bundled Cardboard
- *E-waste *Refrigerator
- Washer and Dryer

*Refrigerator or household appliances containing Freon and other chemicals require special handling and may carry an additional charge.

*Electronic Waste (e-waste) is anything with a circuit board, battery powered, or with a power cord. It is illegal to dispose of e-waste in any of your automated carts, CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle these items. Examples include monitors, televisions, computers, cell phones, printers.

HAZARDOUS WASTE / BATTERIES

Hazardous waste are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. Discarded batteries are hazardous waste in California. Therefore, it is illegal to dispose of them in regular trash or recycling; so do not place them in any of your collection containers. This includes batteries of all types and sizes: Alkaline (AAA, AA, C, D, 9 volt), Lithium-ion (button cell, power tool batteries, camera batteries, other electronics), Ni-Cad (power tools), rechargeable and single use.



Why is it important? Lithium-ion batteries can cause fires in recycling centers, landfills, and garbage and recycling trucks when improperly disposed.

Disposal of needles, lancets and other home-generated sharps in your trash and recycling bins is hazardous and illegal. Needles, lancets and other home generated sharps can be taken to Los Angeles County HHW drop off centers in an approved puncture proof container.
